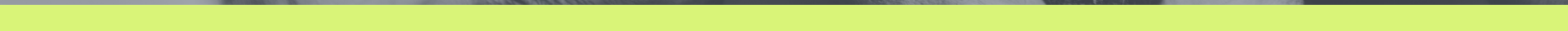

Aviation Museum of New Hampshire

Expanding access to aviation education and preserving New Hampshire's aviation heritage are central to the work of this nonprofit museum and educational center located at Manchester Boston Regional Airport in Londonderry. Grant funding will support the Take Flight program, which gives Lebanon High School students in grades ten through twelve the opportunity to collaboratively assemble a two seat all metal Vans RV 12IS aircraft, a credit earning course that provides hands on STEM learning.

Baby Steps Family Assistance

Providing essential goods to families in need is the focus of this organization, which redistributes new and gently used clothing, diapers, formula, toiletries, and cleaning supplies at no cost. Grant funding will support the purchase of shower passes and phone cards to help individuals and families maintain stability.

Supporting at risk youth and families through educational and community based programs is the mission of Claremont Learning Partnership. Grant funding will support the purchase of two AED units for its childcare center and the Oasis Teen Shelter, strengthening emergency response and safety.

Maximizing students academic, artistic, athletic, and social potential is the goal of the Fall Mountain Regional School District, a community grounded in the values of respect, integrity, citizenship, and responsibility. five students. The program will culminate in an educational field trip to Santas Village in Jefferson, New Hampshire, where students will explore applied science concepts related to water and ice systems, forces and motion, and roller coaster physics.

and one to one instruction, scholarships, and technology that improves access to workshops and meetings.

Newport High School Base Alternative Program

Teaching practical life skills that promote independence is the focus of the Newport High School Base Alternative Program, which provides instruction in cooking, housekeeping, time management, and personal safety. Students apply their learning in real world environments such as local stores, public spaces, and community organizations. Grant funding will support transportation for community based learning, classroom supplies, specialized seating, and regulation tools that help students maintain focus and meet sensory needs.

Leading the Upper Valley in efforts to end violence through survivor centered advocacy, prevention, and education is the mission of WISE, whose Housing Program provides safe and confidential living arrangements for survivors and their children. Grant funding will support the final phase of the Safe Spaces project, including a welcoming and accessible entryway that strengthens the organization's ability to provide safe and effective services.

COMMUNITY COMMITMENT

Since 2003, our Claremont Savings Bank Foundation has awarded grants totaling more than \$2,989,600 to local non-profit organizations for a wide range of charitable initiatives.
